Mimmo Jodice

Mimmo Jodice is one of the great names in the history of Italian photography. He lives in Naples where he was born in 1934. An avant-garde photographer since the 1960s, attentive to the experimentation and expressive possibilities of the language of photography, he has been a tireless protagonist in the cultural debate that has led to the growth and subsequently the affirmation and recognition of Italian photography also in the international arena. Driven by his interests in art, theatre and music, in the 1950s as a self-taught artist he devoted himself to drawing and painting. In the early 1960s, he discovered photography. He then began a series of experiments with the materials and codes of photography, using the medium not as a descriptive but as a creative tool. During these years, Mimmo Jodice lived in close contact with the most important artists of the neo-avant-garde who frequented Naples in those years: Wahrol, Beuys, De Dominicis, Paolini, Kosuth, Lewitt, Kounnellis, Nitsch and many others. Jodice is particularly sensitive to new ideas and devotes himself more and more to creative photography, producing works of conceptual research. In the same years Jodice engages in an intense socio-anthropological investigation into rituality, which will result in the production of a book entitled Chi è devoto. In 1969, he presented his research on portraits, entitled Persona with an introduction by Michele Prisco, at the Deperro bookshop. In 1970 he was invited to hold experimental courses at the Academy of Fine Arts in Naples, where he was to teach Photography until 1994. His first exhibition was presented at the Palazzo Ducale in Urbino in 1968 and in 1970 at the Diaframma in Milan another exhibition entitled Nudi dentro Cartelle Ermetiche with a text by Cesare Zavattini. In 1980 he published Vedute di Napoli (Views of Naples) in which Jodice began a new investigation into reality, working on the definition of a new urban space and landscape, choosing a vision that was not documentary but subtly visionary, of distant metaphysical ancestry, to which he would always remain faithful; this research marked a definitive turning point in his language.1981 he took part in the exhibition Expression of Human Condition at the San Francisco Museum of Art with Diane Arbus, Larry Clark, William Klein, Lisette Model.1985 saw the beginning of a long and in-depth investigation into the myth of the Mediterranean. The result is a book Mediterraneo, published by Aperture, New York, and an exhibition at the Philadelphia Museum of Art.

In 1995, he presented the exhibition Eden at the Lia Rumma Gallery in Naples and later at the Museo di Palazzo Ducale in Mantua, marking a return of interest in everyday objects, now suspended in a dimension of blurred and hallucinated unreality. In 2009, the Palazzo delle Esposizioni in Rome dedicated a large retrospective to him, fifty years of work, from the 1960s to the present day, which was then successfully replicated in Paris at the Maison Européenne de la Photographie.In 2011, he was invited by the Louvre Museum for a solo exhibition

with a new work: Les Yeux du Louvre and in 2012 in Montreal, at the Musée McCord, where he presented a work on Villes sublimes-Sublimes Cities. In 2015, Jodice exhibited Jodice Canova at the Fondazione Francesco Messina in Milan.In 2016, the Madre Museum in Naples dedicated a retrospective to Mimmo Jodice, the largest and most complete exhibition dedicated to him, under the direction of Andrea Viliani.As a testimony to this important exhibition, in 2018 the Madre Museum in Naples produced an important and comprehensive monograph on all his work entitled Mimmo Jodice. Waiting/Waiting (from/from 1960).In 2017, the MAST Foundation in Bologna inaugurated the exhibition Gli Anni Militanti curated by François Hébel.

In 2018 his famous work Mediterraneo is presented at the Eretz Museum in Tel Aviv, subsequently exhibited in all North African capitals. Also in this year at the Photography Biennial in Moscow he exhibits his works Attesa, Eden and Transiti in the Multimedia Art Museum.In 2019 the exhibition Jodice/Canova is presented at Palazzo Braschi in Rome. In 2022, he participates with the exhibition 'Abitare Metafisico' in Procida Capital of Culture. In the same year, he is invited by Quentin Bajac and Diana Dufour to the Jeu de Paume for the exhibition 'Renverser ses yeux.Autour de l'Arte Povera 1960-1975: photographie, film, vidéo'. The exhibition will then be presented in May 2023 at the Milan Triennale. In June 2023, a solo exhibition entitled 'Senza Tempo' was presented at the Gallerie d'Italia in Turin, curated by Roberto Koch. In July 2023, at the Gibellina Museum of Contemporary Art, he presented 'II paesaggio del pensiero, Gibellina 1980/1981/1982', curated by Arianna Catania. It is also worth mentioning the honours he received for his artistic commitment, in fact in 2003, the Accademia dei Lincei awarded him the prestigious Antonio Feltrinelli prize for the first time given to Photography. Also in 2003, his name was included in the Enciclopedia Universale dell'Arte Garzanti and in the Enciclopedia Treccani.

In 2006, the University Federico II of Naples awarded him an Honorary Degree in Architecture. In 2011, the French Ministry of Culture honoured him with the Chevalier de l'Ordre des Art set des Lettres. In 2013, he received an Honorary Degree in Architecture from the Swiss Italian University.
